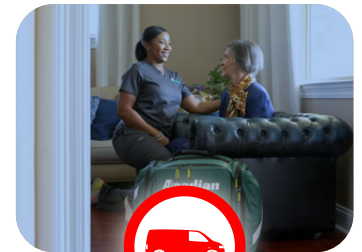

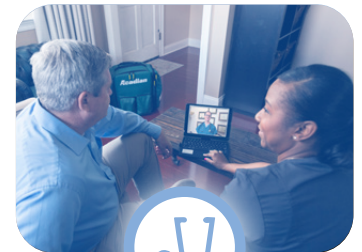

WHEN TO CALL 911 INSTEAD

If the patient is experiencing any of the following symptoms, call 911:

- Chest pain
- Stroke symptoms (numbness/weakness on one side, difficulty speaking, swallowing or walking)
- Vomiting blood
- Rectal bleeding
- Loss of consciousness
- Loss of vision
- Confusion
- Severe abdominal pain
- Intentional overdose or suicidal thoughts
- Moderate to severe shortness of breath
- Hallucinations
